We're Democrats because we care, and want to create a just future. I'm active in many social justice campaigns, but climate comes first. Why? Climate is fundamentally unlike our other justice issues.

First, unlike with Selma, we can't take climate injustice back. CO2 persists pragmatically forever. Extinct species won't return; rising seas will still inundate our coasts and cities; extreme storms, wildfires, floods, droughts, water shortages, acidification, and desertification will still plague us; and billions will still thirst, starve, and fight for resources as population rises and food production suffers.

Second, unlike with Ferguson, we never see anyone die unequivocally from fossil fuels. The millions of people already dying, most still from air pollution, are all just statistics. And the trillions who will ultimately suffer and die are far away, far in the future.

Third, unlike tobacco disinformation, the fossil industry's well-disguised, billion-dollar-a-year war on climate science and economics is unprecedented both in scope and effectiveness. It's deceived enough of us, at least in part, and has bribed enough of our lawmakers with superpac ads and primarying threats, to block legislative progress.

Fourth, unlike local, state, and national issues, climate requires worldwide government cooperation.

Fifth, unlike with domestic issues, climate is our whole world, and everything in it, forever. Without climate justice, justice will be just bandages on a critically wounded planet.

Sixth, climate won't wait. The future of all darkens with every day that How Many Lumens Do You Need? (120V) passes without decisive climate policy.

All those reasons are also why I'm so deeply gratified by climate action. I have no money, no time, and no regrets. Where else could I create a better future, for everyone, for all time? Where else could you?



Eating meat and climate change. By Dr. Mary Headrick

Man-Made Climate Change

Did you know that 1.8 lb. CO2e emitted per gallon gas used and 210 lb. CO2e emitted per 150 kWh electricity used? Eating beef instead of fish and beans 'costs' lots more CO2e emissions? That 15.5 Tons CO2e emitted per capita per year in U.S., higher than other nations, twice China's per capita? Care about kids and their future? Our planet is like an automobile in the sun with children locked inside and closing windows. Around 1950, Earth's windows started rolling up much faster due to man-made greenhouse gases (GHGs), mainly carbon dioxide (CO2), from burning fossil fuels. We risk locking our grandchildren on a hot and hostile planet. Transportation, electricity and food are the large GHG emitters that we control individually. Let's burn less gas, use less non-renewable electric energy and either stop eating beef or eat only grass fed local beef in small quantities. Visit http://www3.epa.gov/carbon-footprint-calculator/ to find ways to cut your individual GHG emissions (measured as CO2 equivalents, CO2e). Together, we can decrease GHGs by demanding, now and at the ballot box, that our government adopt fair policies to reduce total GHGs. From TVA, let's demand energy efficiency and safe renewable energy sources, like solar and wind. The science is clear. Man-made Climate Change is real and dangerous. Our large feedlot production of beef feeding grain costs lots in CO2e emissions because of the oil intense way we produce the grain, transport the beef and the beef actually fart lots of methane, a powerful green house gas.
